Est. 1836 | Population 103,000 | Aug. 2001 - June 2015

Open, agile and purposeful CAO of historic, diverse city. Report to Mayor & 10 member Council. 1,000+/- employees & \$250M+/- budget.

In Brief: Led dynamic, transparent & participative revitalization, with strong school and business partnerships. Set tenure record, received Key to City.

Highlights Include: Cut crime by 57% / Grew city over 100,000 / Improved operating efficiency by 62% / City taxes for new investment cut in half / \$2B+ taxbase growth / With partners, secured \$1B+ state & federal funds / Doubled fund balance / \$100M+ new & renovated cultural attractions / Net City assets increased \$50M+ / Multiple LEED buildings / 250+ acres of parks added or improved / Midwest's largest 4 STAR city / Led 13 successful flood fights from the front lines / Downtown thriving & leading region in new investment / Full ADA access / 9 direct reports become CAOs

Douglas County, Wisconsin

Est. 1854 | Population 42,000 | June 1999–August 2001

CAO for 1,340 square mile county on the shore of Lake Superior, with 272,000 acre County-owned forest. Report to 30 member Board. Supervise 18 appointed department heads, collaborate with 5 elected department heads and direct labor relations for 350 employees. Responsible for \$52M budget.

In Brief: Serve as second career professional CAO in County history (the first resigned after 100 days).

Highlights Include: Simultaneously serve as CAO, Personnel Director and Zoning Administrator. Settle all labor contracts without arbitration. Implement first performance evaluation program and reorganize departments to better serve citizens. Oversee largest project in County history (\$43M) incorporating Superior City Hall into County-built metro government center, reducing combined costs by \$18M. Two direct reports become County Administrators. Serve as consultant to County following separation.

ASSISTANT MANAGER / ASSISTANT TO THE MANAGER / ADMINISTRATIVE ASSISTANT

Vernon Hills, Illinois

Est. 1958 | Population 20,000 (daytime 60,000+) | September 1988–June 1999

Assistant Manager responsible for community development, human resources, staff supervision, environmental programs, risk management, tech support, public information, facilities, grants and budget coordination.

In Brief: Jack of all trades assistant for inclusive, high service quality suburb, helping position community to feature a AAA bond rating and no municipal property tax. Received Key to City.

Highlights Include: Coordinate annexation of thousands of acres and \$2B of consistently improving development. Develop fiscal impact model guiding land use and budget decisions. Multimillion grant acquisition and service delivery savings. Integral part of management team which doubled size and population, with a nearly eightfold tax base increase; design / construction of every major municipal facility, and accumulation of fund balance equal to two years operating budget, all while delivering outstanding services without a property tax. Direct reports move on to professional success, including one becoming a City Manager.

Prairie Crossing Charter School

1995–1999

Charter author and founding board member of the first parent-created school authorized by the Illinois Board of Education.
